The Ren's Student Committee is an active group of students, both undergraduate and graduate, from any college or university in Chicago. Students in all fields of study are encouraged to apply; all you need is an interest in contemporary art and the Renaissance Society's program. There are no member enrollment limits this season: all applicants will be accepted.

The Committee will convene monthly during the academic year to participate in a program of activities unique to the group. We're currently looking for new members who are enthusiastic about contemporary art and excited to engage closely with the Ren and its program.

Committee activities begin in October 2024 and extend through June 2025. Participants should expect roughly one engagement per month, including meetings, field trips, workshops, opportunities to meet artists, and more. Consistent attendance is encouraged but not strictly required, and some programs may have limits on the number of participants, with spots allocated among Committee members by first come, first served RSVP.
